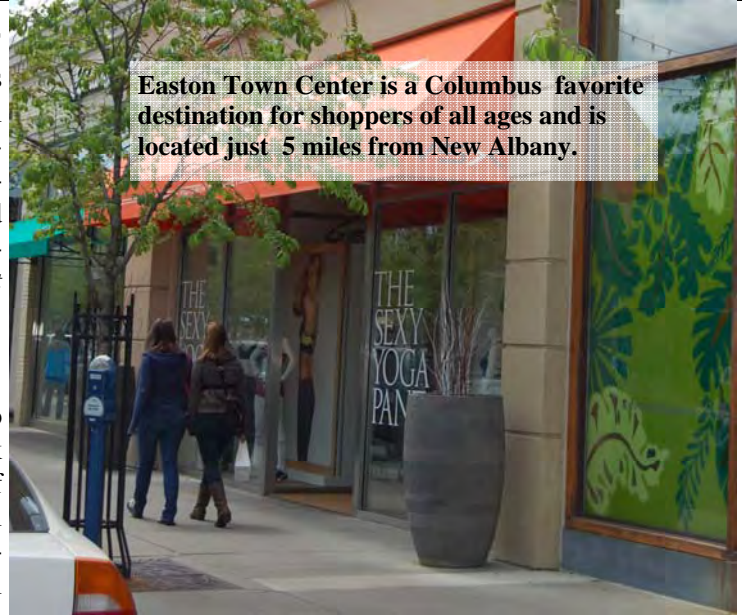

### **Business Park Expansion in Annexation**

New Albany and the New Albany Company hope to add 102 acres from Jersey Township to Business Park East. The land, which is owned by NACO is part of Jersey Township and the Johnstown-Monroe Local School District. If Licking County commissioners approve the annexation agreement, the land, which will be zoned agricultural upon annexation, would become part of the revenue-sharing agreement among the Village and the Johnstown-Monroe school district. *ThisWeek Newspaper, Gail Martineau, 6 May 2010, P.A1-A2*

### **Hotel planned for New Albany Business Park**

...Jennifer Chrysler (Community Development Director) noted that the incentive package designed to attract a much needed hotel to NA produced the new 120 room Marriott Courtyard Hotel. The incentive allows the Hotel Development Services to keep half the revenue from the six percent bed tax that council voted to enact in February. The incentive will be in place for ten years and is estimated to allow the company to keep \$125,000 annually, based on a 60-percent occupancy for the hotel *ThisWeek Newspaper, Gail Martineau, 6 May 2010, P.A1-A2*

**TJ Maxx** The parent company of TJ Maxx, HomeGoods and Marshalls received incentives to build a 60,000 square foot corporate technology center in New Albany Business Park! Approximately 28 people will be employed at the project with a payroll of \$1.5 million with average salaries of \$54,000. This will produce \$165,000 annually in property tax for the New Alban Plain Local School District and about \$101,000 for the Village. A 65 percent, 15 year abatement on the property was offered as the local incentive. TJX is the world's leading retailer of off-price apparel and ranks 131 in the 2009 Fortune 500 rankings. Plans are to break ground in this summer.

## Business News...

**Parents' Policy Can Keep Kids on Health Insurance till Age 26...**The White House issued rules yesterday allowing young adults to remain covered by their parents' health-insurance policies up to age 26. The promise of such coverage has attracted more interest than any other part of the healthcare overhaul enacted this year. Under the rules, an employer-sponsored health plan or a company selling individual insurance policies must offer coverage to subscribers' children up to the age of 26, regardless of whether a child lives with his/her parents, attends college, is a dependent for income-tax purposes, or receives financial support from the parents. Coverage is to be available to married and unmarried children alike. The cost will be borne by all families with employer-sponsored insurance, with family premiums expected to rise about 1 percent, the government said. The rules generally take effect for insurance-plan years that begin on or after September 23. However, the rules allow an exception for employer-sponsored health plans that were in existence on Mar 23, when President Barack Obama signed the healthcare law. In general, such health plans can exclude adult children of workers until 2014 if the children have access to insurance through another employer-sponsored health plan. Many insurance companies have voluntarily agreed to provide dependent coverage immediately, without waiting for the requirement to take effect in September 2010 or in January 2011, when many companies renew their coverage. Under the rules, insurers and employers must provide young adults with a 30-day opportunity to enroll in their parents' coverage. Terms of coverage cannot vary based on the age of young adults not yet 26. *Columbus Dispatch, Robert Pear, 11 May, 2010*

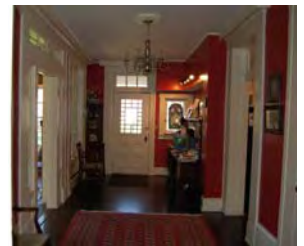

## 2010 New Albany Independence Day Parade Rules

New Albany Community Events, Inc. reserves the right to change, adapt or modify any or all rules involving the New Albany Independence Day Parade. By signing this document, you assume all responsibility for your entry and further agree to follow instructions of any parade official on the parade day and all rules and regulations herein.

- 1.) **VIOLATION OF RULES** - Any entry that violates Parade Rules can be excluded from the 2010 parade and may also be excluded from future parades.
- 2.) **DISTRIBUTION OF CANDY AND/OR LITERATURE** – **Only individuals walking at the curb are permitted to distribute candy and/or literature.** Do not throw items from a moving vehicle or into the crowd. You need at least 4 individuals, 2 at either side of the street to distribute items. Your walkers need to keep pace with your entry and your entry must keep pace with the parade.
- 3.) **HORSES/HORSE DRAWN UNITS** – All horses and horse drawn entries must have provisions to immediately remove any animal excrement from the street or staging area of the parade. This can be accomplished with a catcher attached to the horse or horse drawn unit or by having a separate “clean up” unit following your entry.
- 4.) **REMAIN IN THE VEHICLE/ENTRY/KEEP MOVING.** Do not exit your entry (float or vehicle) once the parade starts. It is also critical that the driver of any entry remain with the vehicle at all times once the vehicle has entered the line-up position. Do not stop or slow down unless the parade slows or stops. Maintain your instructed distance from the unit in front of you.
- 5.) **HEIGHT OF UNIT** – cannot exceed 14 feet.
- 6.) **EMERGENCY VEHICLES** – Should an emergency occur, **PULL TO THE RIGHT OF THE ROAD AND ALLOW THE EMERGENCY VEHICLE TO PASS.**

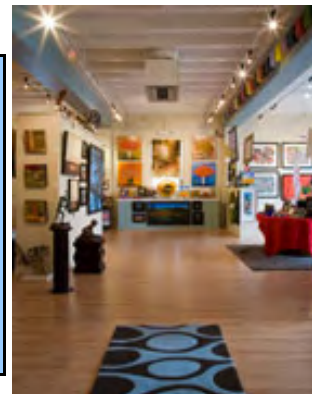
