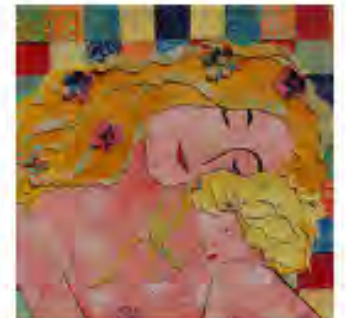

MSI will provide the district with \$95,000 in master planning services to map out future expansion of the district's academic campus. Ken Stark, the district's director of operations and planning, said the general construction timeline for new school buildings is about two years from the design phase to move-in.

New Albany residents are to join a handful of other central Ohio's gridSMART project. The Village, Gahanna, Whitehall, Bexley, Reynoldsburg, Westerville, Alexandria, Blacklick, Johnstown, and Pataskala will be included in the pilot program that covers 150 square miles with about 110,000 "smart meters". The smart meters enable the company to bill customers for their power usage, as well as allow customers to control amounts on their bills. Gregory S. Griffith, AEP Ohio customer-services representative notes that the installation of the new meters—part of a \$150 million project that includes \$75 million in federal stimulus money—began in mid-December and will continue to go through March. Everybody's meter will be replaced. The goal is to reduce energy consumption in general and during peak hours in particular. The hope is to have some of their customers, who view their power usage on an hourly basis, would be willing to shift their lifestyles sufficiently to move more of their electricity consumption to off-peak evening and weekend hours.

# Development News...

**Village/NACo Work with J-M Schools on Tax-Break Deal...**The Johnstown-Monroe School Board approved legislation to offer tax abatements to businesses looking to develop in a 279-acre site that is in New Albany, but also in the Johnstown School District; the New Albany Company owns the site. The three-party agreement gives J-M approval for NA to grant property-tax incentives that could exempt, abate, redirect or redistribute the district's portion of property-tax revenues derived from future improvements to all or any portion of the property. In accordance, New Albany obligates itself to share with J-M an agreement a portion of income-tax revenues generated by future development on the property. In recognition of the benefits it would receive from the execution of the agreement, J-M agrees to provide support toward MJB Holdings', a New Albany Company affiliate, efforts to annex the property to the village and their efforts to zone the property for non-residential use. According to the deal, for each dollar spent, 30 cents would go to paying back debt and 15 cents would be used to pay the city of Columbus for water and sewer services for 15 years.

**Walton-605 Intersection to Begin...**The New Albany Service Department is ready to use the \$500,000 in American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds it received last year for the Walton Parkway and state Route 605 intersection project. Village council members awarded the job to Kokosing Construction Co., which will start work in the spring, notes department director, Mark Nemeec. All roads will remain open during the project, which is expected to take about two months to complete.

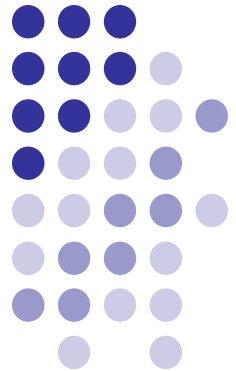
